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## **PSYCH 337: Service Learning Experience**

During the Fall 2017, students enrolled in Dr. Mary Katherine Duncan's PSYCH 337 Developmental Psychopathology course used Gardner's theory of multiple intelligences as a conceptual guide to select literacy and play resources to fill 100 suitcases for children and youth served by Columbia County's foster care program. This project was funded by the Joan and Fred Miller Distinguished professor of Good Work Fellowship.









Under the supervision of Dr. Jennifer Johnson, members of the Psychology Association handcrafted holiday greeting cards for each of the duffle bags.



Art major (Ashley Lopez) created luggage tags to identify the duffle bags as gifts from Bloomsburg University and to give each child a place to record their name and current address.

Suitcases were presented to representatives from Columbia County's Children & Youth.

We learned that the number of children had risen substantially over the Fall semester. The scope of our project ensured that each child would receive a filled duffle bag over the holiday season.



# **PSYCH 327: Service Learning Experience**



During the Spring 2018, students enrolled in Dr. Mary Katherine Duncan's PSYCH 327 Positive Psychology course used Peterson & Seligman's (2004) *Character Strengths and Virtues: A Handbook and Classification System* as a conceptual guide to handcraft scrapbooks and purchase collections of children's picture books to fill 150 tote bags for children in foster care served by Montour County Children & Youth and KidsPeace Foster Care in Danville, seriously ill children served by the Ronald McDonald House of Danville and Geisinger Medical Center's Janet Weiss Children's Hospital, as well as older adults served by Maria Joseph Manor (Danville, PA) and Bloom Mills Senior Center (Bloomsburg, PA). This project was funded by the Joan and Fred Miller Distinguished Professor of Good Work Fellowship.
